

Rain Stick

Resources

Cardboard Tube (kitchen towel or sweet tube)

Tin foil

Small beads/Rice/Beans

Glue or tape

Decorations (optional)

Suggestion

Scrunch foil into long snake shapes and twist into a spring shape

Place into the tube and gently pull at each end to make a spiral.

Cover one end of the tube

Add filling (rice, beans)

cover the open end

Decorate & shake

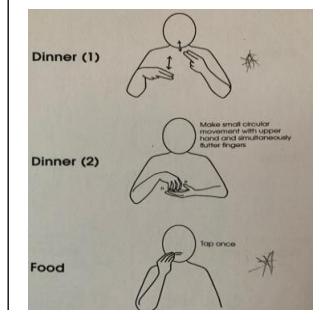
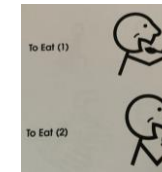
